It is my pleasure to announce the birth of a strapping dark bay/brown Thoroughbred colt, who, upon Jockey Club approval, will be named ANGIE'S LaBELLE, after Mom.

On one of our drives last fall, I took Mom to the Birsch Family horse farm near Amsterdam, N.Y. As usual, she charmed everyone there and had a blast visiting her old friends Joe Spadaro and farm manager Mike Tobin, as well as the cast of characters that included seven broodmares in-foal, two young Clydesdales, Standardbred horses owned by NYRA track announcer Tom Durkin and Spadaro, and another Thoroughbred mare, owned by another friend, retired Newsday columnist Paul Moran.

Tobin is a real good guy who has managed and designed several horse farms in New York State. Mike owns the mare, Career Year, and as the breeder, it was his idea to name this foal after Mom.

Originally, it was only going to be named for Mom if it was a filly (LaBelle Angie would have been her name). But when it came out a colt, they said 'what the hell?' and made the change. Again, the Jockey Club has to approve it, but this should be merely a rubber stamp that will be official on Tuesday.

ANGIE'S LaBELLE was foaled on Thursday, February 26 at 11:11 p.m. under a new moon. "I know the exact time he was born because he took three hours to nurse," Tobin said. "He is kind of tall and because his head was so far above the "bag," he had to learn to bow down and bend around to nurse." He is a son of Artie Schiller, 2005 Breeders' Cup Mile winner and turf course record setter for nine furlongs at Belmont Park (1:45.50) in the 2004 Jamaica. The dam is Career Year, by Technical Cat.
